One of my abiding memories of Neil is of him in the dressing room talking very loudly into a walkie-talkie to try and contact the lighting box. "Robin! Are you receiving me?". Our thoughts are with Liz - herself a former President and active member of the club - and their family.

That is, I think, all I want to say about the last year. It is my intention - definitely this year - to step down as President. I would just like, therefore, to put on my record my thanks and appreciation for the members of the Committee who have worked so hard this year, and over the six years I have been President. They have made my job much much easier than it could have been. They have put up with my lapses of memory and they have kept me right.
